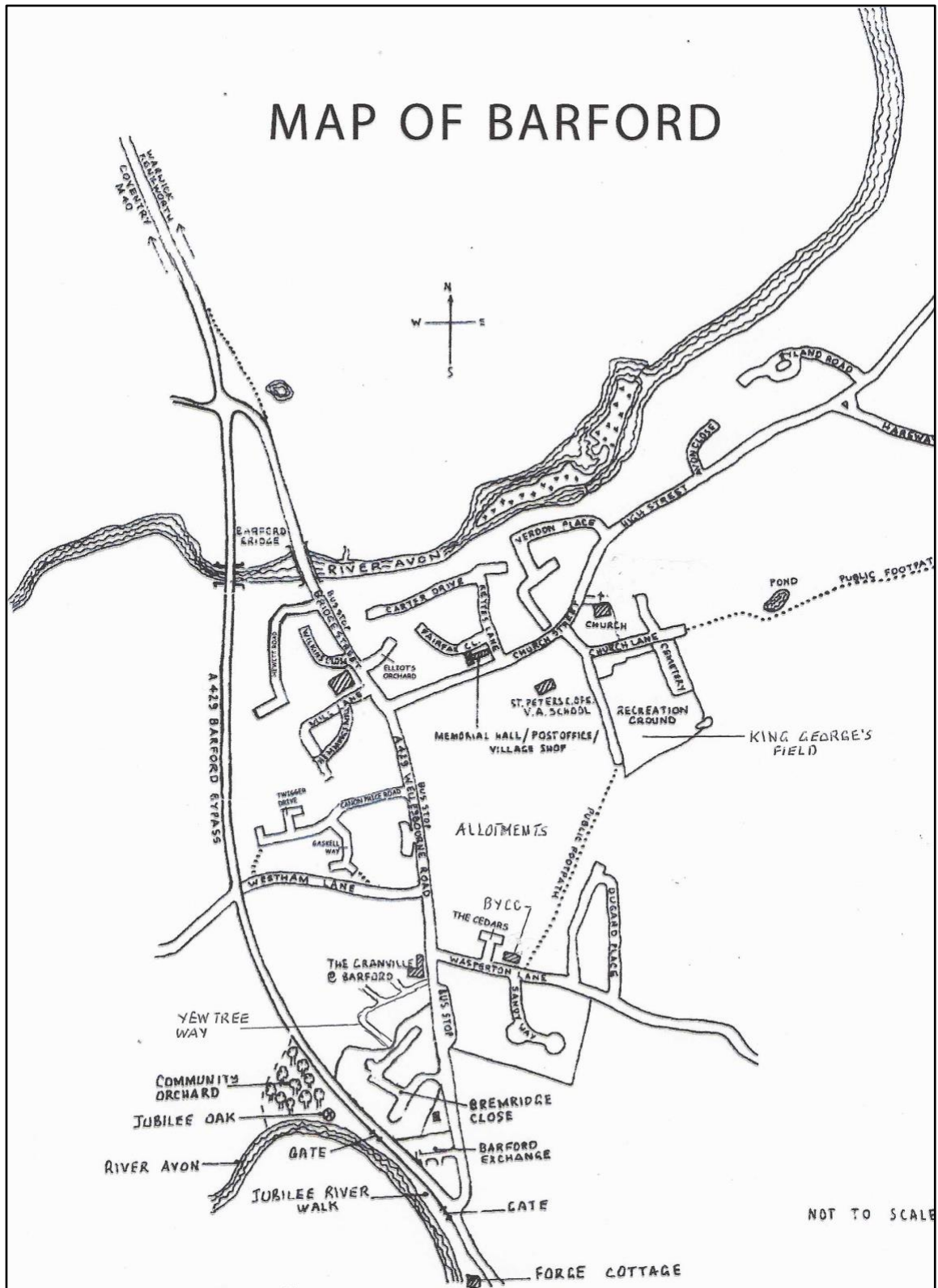

King George's Field, off Church Lane, Barford CV35 8ES

King George's Field is an award winning free to use sports facility for the residents of Barford, Sherbourne, and Wasperton, which has become a destination leisure facility with many visitors and level access to all areas. Construction of the field was a community-led project

completed in 2016, and now offers tennis, MUGA, (Multi User Games Area) football, outdoor gym equipment, netball, picnic tables, children's play area, public w.c. and recreational facilities used by the local community and school all the year round. Tennis courts and MUGA can be advance booked for a modest 'reservation fee' There is no dedicated parking, so if you need to travel by car, be considerate to the neighbours and avoid parking in Church Lane.

Memorial Hall, Church Street

The Hall is for use by villagers and others, for functions. Seating is available for about 90 people 'theatre style' or about 70 at tables. There is a stage, curtained off but available. Lighting is from LED lights or from wall up-lighters that can be dimmed. There are male, female and accessible toilets, wheelchair access and a car park. There is a well-equipped kitchen and separate bar with crockery, cutlery and glasses.

Youth & Community Centre

This is situated on Wasperton Lane, by the footpath between Wasperton Lane and Church Lane (there is also a gate allowing vehicle access for short periods). It is used by several of the community groups and can be hired for regular or one-off activities, events or meetings.

There is a large Hall (capacity up to 100 seated in rows or 70 at tables) with a well-equipped Kitchen and adjoining Bar, and a separate Meeting Room (capacity approx. 12). There is also an enclosed outdoor area (grassed / paved). The Centre has four toilets including one which is wheelchair accessible.

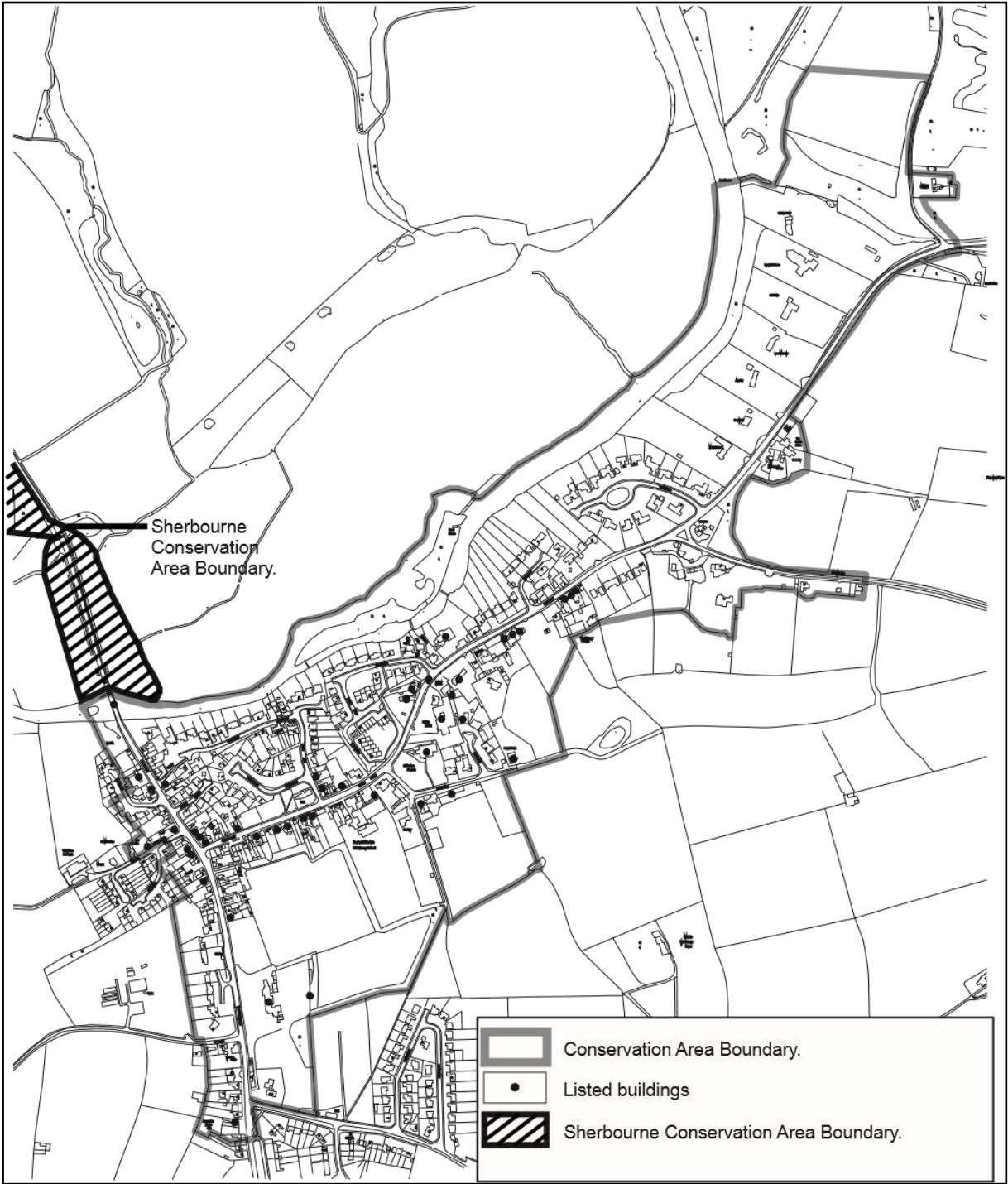
The Conservation Area in Barford was designated in 1969 and extended in 2002 and is outlined on the map below;.

Listed Buildings

The following properties are statutorily protected as Listed Buildings within the Barford Conservation Area. Because these buildings are of high architectural and historic interest, they are among the top 2% of buildings in England statutorily protected. All Saints Church was built by Miss Louisa Ann Ryland 1862/4 and designed by Sir George Gilbert Scott RA, an eminent Victorian architect of the day. Features include marble columns with carved capitals by Farmer of London, stained glass windows by Clayton and Bell, a table tomb designed by Augustus Pugin.

Inside the church is a memorial to **Henry Eric Maudslay D.F.C.** killed in the attack on the Möhne Dam (Dambusters) in 1943.

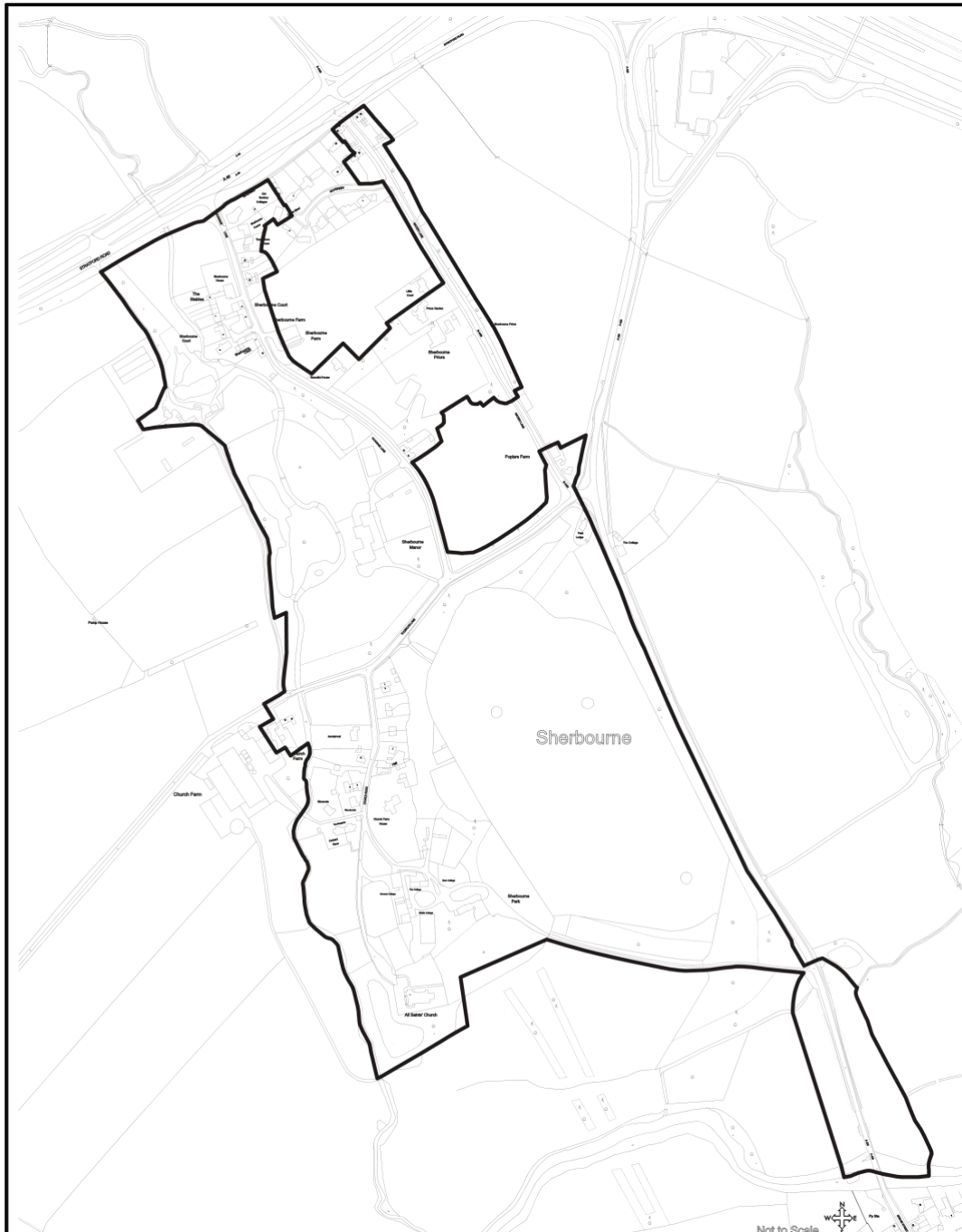

Map 1 – Sherbourne Conservation Area

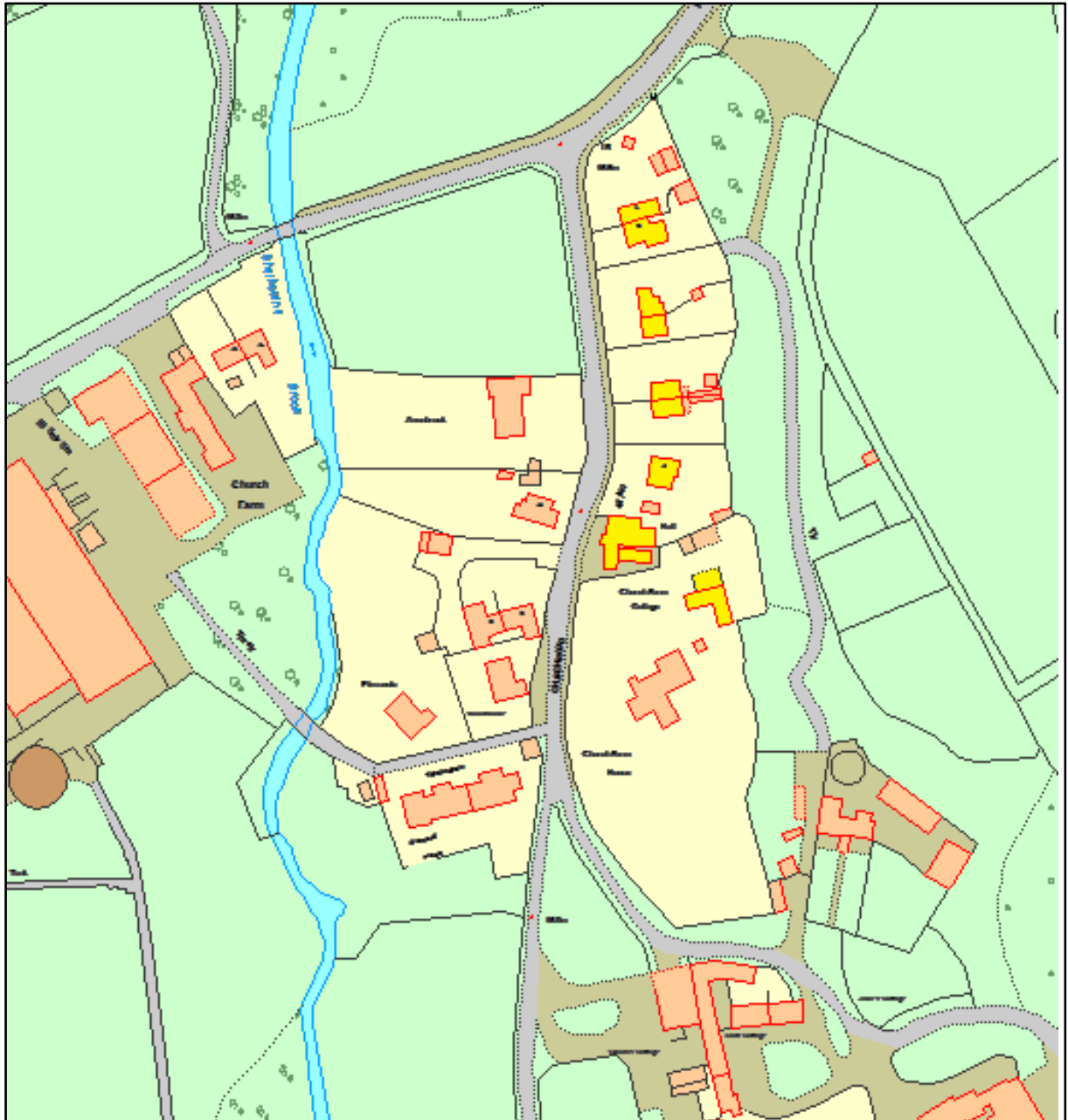


Article 4 Direction
